"It's just been a dream to live in this township where there is a lot of people passionate about what they do. Whether its baking or massaging or pursuing their arty pursuits, it's a very special town."


The awards were presented at Melbourne's Telstra Dome in front of about 300 people.

A touch of masterclass


LOCAL highly skilled artists will be able to come together later this month in an art master-
